Beginning in 2010, the United States Census Bureau replaced its Decennial Census Long Form with the American Community Survey (ACS). Like the Decennial Census, the ACS gathers information on population development, population structure, and living conditions. ACS data is used by the federal government to allocate funding, and it provides data that is used by federal officials to set policy at the national level. The ACS also gives states and local communities the current, relevant information they need to plan services and make investments. The ACS gathers relevant demographic data (including American Indian or Alaska Native status), economic data (e.g. income, foods stamps benefit, and employment status), social data (e.g. disability and veteran status), housing data (e.g. year structure built, number of rooms, and kitchen and plumbing facilities), and data on financial characteristics (e.g. owner/renter, rent paid, and housing value).
